# A SHINING LIGHT IN CHONGÓN

You could feel the love radiating as the community of Chongón, Ecuador gathered at the Young Living Academy on May 20, 2018 to celebrate the man who impacted so many of their lives. As students and staff reminisced on Founder Gary Young's love, they planted a Ceibo tree in his honor.

Fifth grader Dylan Santana made a promise to Gary's legacy. He said, "Today we are sad for him leaving, but his legacy stays with us. Beyond being grateful, I promise to fulfill his dream and will work hard to become a future leader of Ecuador."

Just a few months prior to the memorial service, 23 seniors walked across the stage in anticipation of the opportunity that would await them as high school graduates. The Young Living Academy's third graduating class maintained the 100 percent graduation rate. Overall, 15 students are currently enrolled in a university studying for careers in medicine, engineering, business, and more!

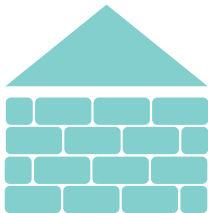


# BUILDING A BRIGHTER FUTURE

Three years after families watched their homes collapse in the 2015 earthquakes, residents of Yarsa, Nepal moved into new homes in May 2018. The new Yarsa Primary School is known as a Young Living Academy where over 40 children receive a quality education.

Now, we're ready to do more. Sixteen schools in the Tanahun district are in a degree of disrepair following the earthquakes and can't reach maximum capacity. In fact, they're forced to turn students away. To empower the schools and ensure as many children as possible have access to education, local workers and volunteers began restoration efforts in August 2018.

A quality education in Nepal can be costly, which is why the Khairenitar Women's Cooperative is empowering mothers to start a business. In 2019, we are looking forward to building a new co-op center for 2,500 women like Nirmala Thapa who once struggled to grow her business. After receiving and paying back loans from the co-op, she went from raising five chickens to over 300 for profitable resale. She uses the loans to help cover her operating costs, and the profit to pay back the loan and to support her children through school.



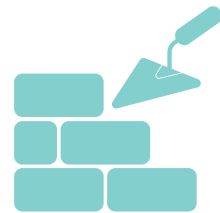

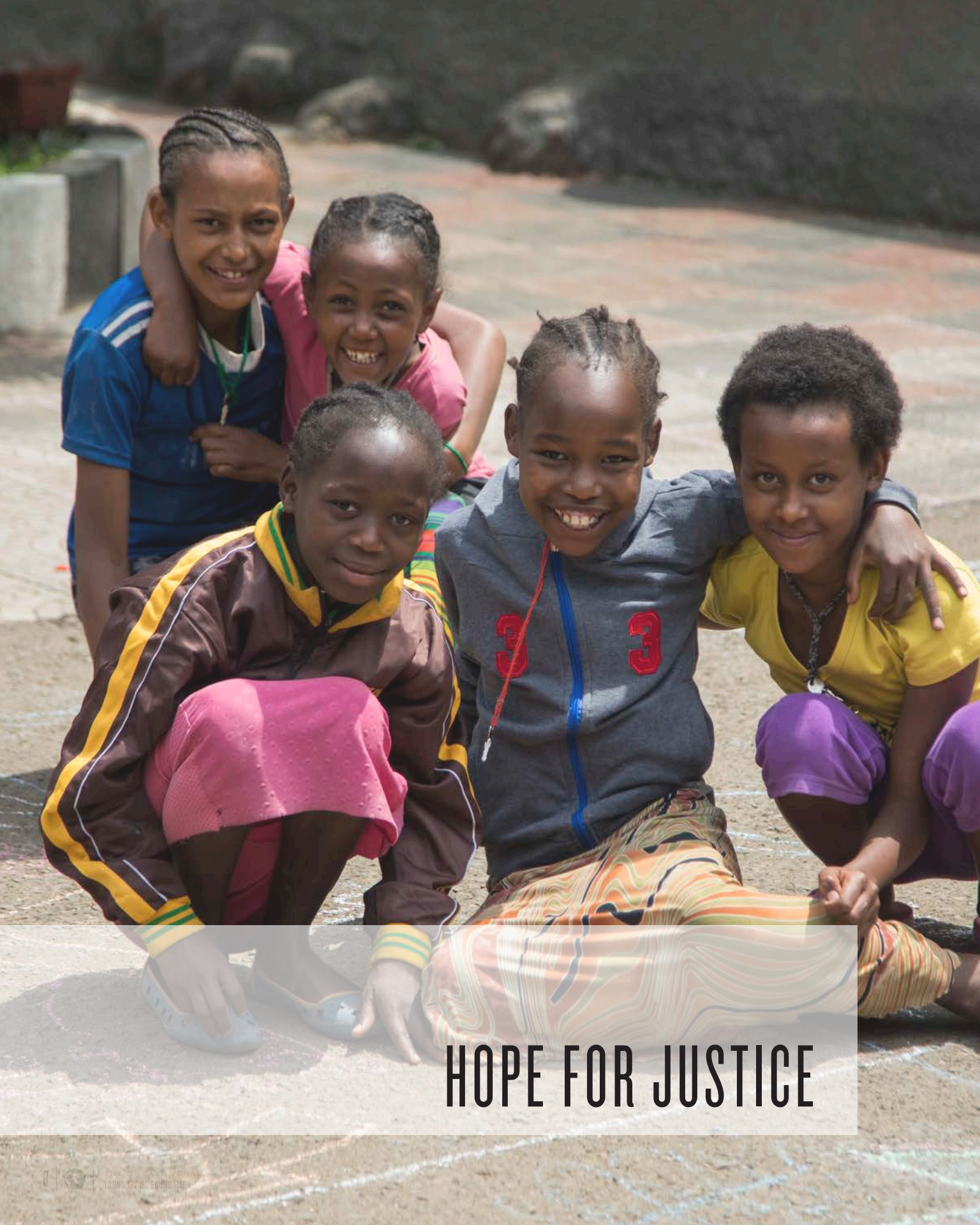

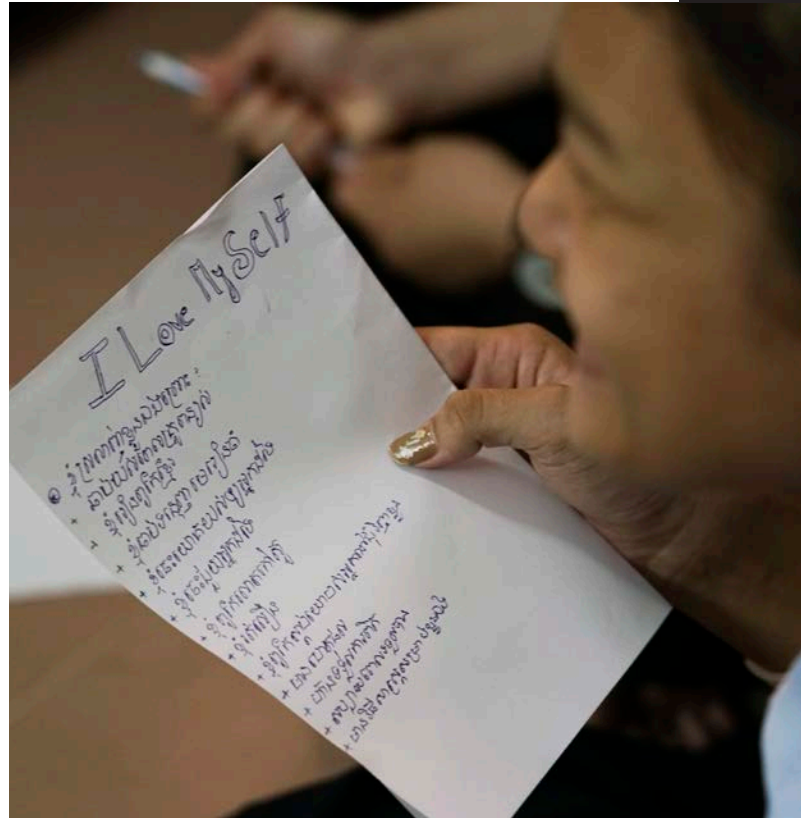
# ENDING MODERN SLAVERY

Ma Ni\* blamed herself for what happened after she left home to escape her father's abuse. Accepting what she thought would be a great opportunity, Ma Ni took a job working for one of her customers in Thailand. Tasks she was hired to complete such as household chores and cleaning turned into assault and abuse as Ma Ni was sold time and time again.

With a brave, fighting spirit, Ma Ni knew there had to be a way out and ultimately escaped her captors in Thailand. She made her way back to safety in Cambodia and sought refuge with police who transported her to the Hope for Justice Lighthouse Assessment Center in Phnom Penh. At last, she was safe and could begin healing.

Every day, young women just like Ma Ni have the opportunity to reclaim their lives through the support Hope for Justice offers thanks to the generosity of our donors. With your help, the Foundation proudly supports nine Lighthouses across Cambodia, Uganda, and Ethiopia, a transit center in Poipet, and is funding the expansion of the Shine Career School in Cambodia.

# LIVES RENEWED AT MALARIA CENTER

In a matter of a few short days, 6-year-old Trevor's health significantly worsened. The young boy usually full of energy was too weak to get out of bed. His mother, concerned for her son's life, rushed Trevor to The D. Gary Young, Young Living Foundation Malaria Center where he received immediate treatment.

He tested positive for malaria, received an emergency IV to raise his dangerously low blood sugar, and a dose of medicine to rapidly clear the malaria parasites. Once stable, he was transported to a nearby children's hospital for continued care. Healing Faith staff visited Trevor (pictured right with his mom) each day in the hospital to ensure he received proper care.

On August 9, the Malaria Center celebrated one year of saving lives just like Trevor's. In its first year of operation, the center tested and treated 4,427 patients, 3,157 of whom tested positive for malaria and received care. Because it costs about \$2 or less to test and treat an individual suffering from malaria, every time you round up your Young Living order or make a direct donation, you are contributing to a person's wellbeing, helping empower others with every penny donated!

# A STORY OF HOPE

When his mother fell ill, Andrew gave up his dream job of surveying Uganda to care for his mother, Prossy. When he returned to his home village, he realized that his mother had become debilitated by jiggers. For six years, Prossy suffered from isolation, hunger, and poverty onset by the jiggers keeping her bedridden.

It wasn't long before Andrew started to also be infected, ultimately losing his business, home, and health to this tiny parasite. One day Andrew's son came to visit. Startled by the despair he saw in his father and grandmother, he connected the family with Sole Hope. After spending two weeks at Sole Hope's Outreach Center, Andrew and Prossy (pictured right) returned to their village healthy and empowered with knowledge on how to stay jigger free! In fact, 91 percent of patients Sole Hope treats at the center remain jigger free.

Construction continued on the new Hope Center all year in anticipation of a January 2019 grand opening. Once open, the Hope Center will have the capacity to care for 3,000 patients a year and will employ 30 Ugandan care workers. Thanks to your generosity, the Foundation will fund the Hope Center's operations for its first year, allowing Sole Hope to focus on providing the best care to underserved individuals in Uganda.

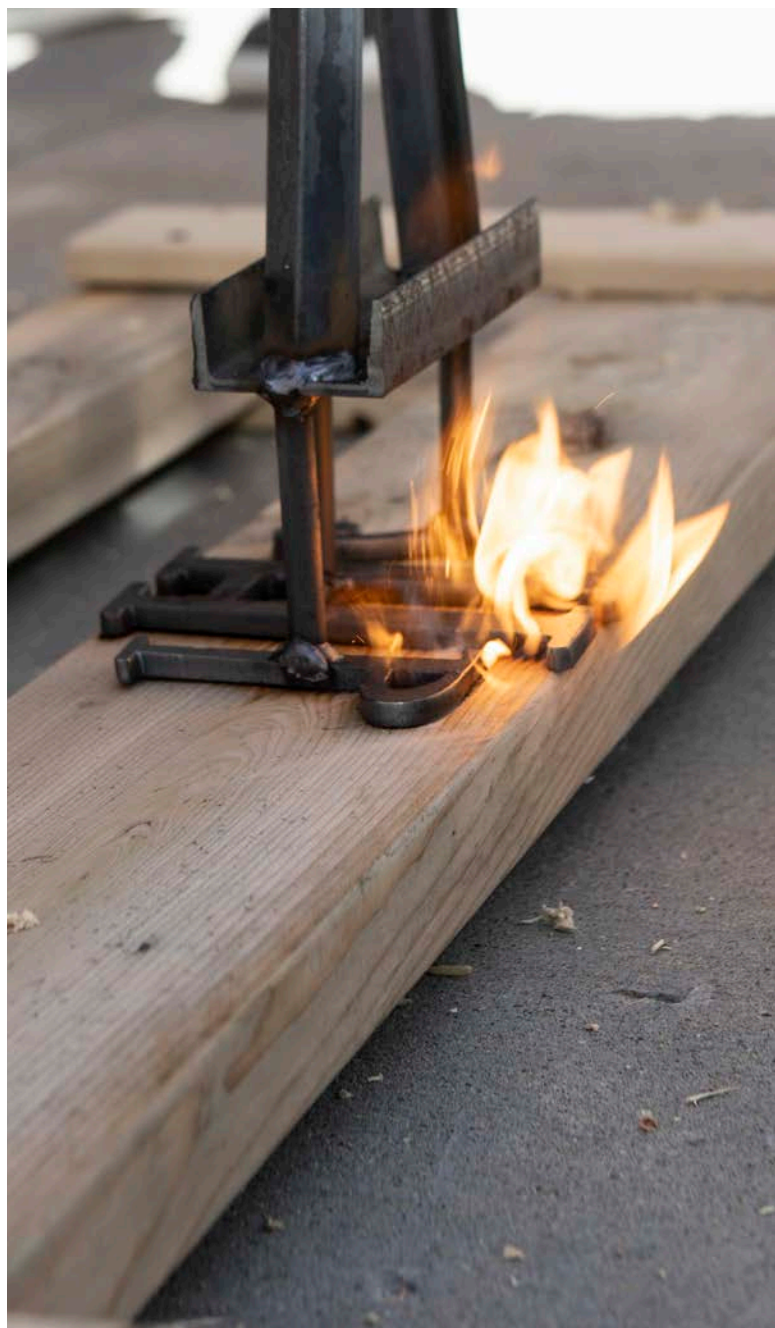

# DOMESTIC OUTREACH

While our key partnerships and projects operate internationally, each year we team up with domestic organizations that share our mission and vision. In 2018, we donated Young Living products or funds to 38 organizations, enacting positive change in communities across the United States.

One of these non-profits, Girls on the Run Utah, empowers girls in grades 3–8 to recognize their inner strength and celebrate what makes them one of a kind. Over the course of a 10-week program, girls develop essential skills to help them navigate their worlds and establish a lifetime appreciation for health and fitness, culminating with a service project and celebratory 5K.

During the last quarter of 2018, Hurricane Michael swept through Florida, leaving countless individuals affected by the devastation. Care kits were provided to Young Living members impacted by the disaster and we teamed up with the Sonder Project, donating \$5,000 to help the organization clean up affected areas and provide support to those in need of a hand up.

## VOLUNTEER HOURS: 4,468

Young Living's corporate culture is all about wellness in every aspect, including the strength and wellbeing of employees' communities. To support this belief, each year Young Living and the Foundation team up to provide opportunities for employees to give back.

Tiny Tim's Foundation for Kids is a nonprofit organization that makes and distributes tiny toy cars to children in need around the world. Young Living employees had the opportunity to visit the toy shop to assemble the little cars made from donated materials. The toys will bring smiles to deserving children's faces.

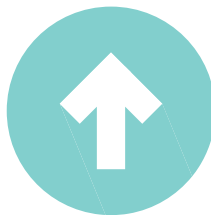

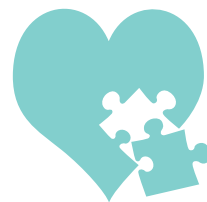

# TECHO RELIEF RECAP

The Flores family supports itself by making and selling handwoven baskets crafted out of locally sourced materials. Once created, family members travel from market to market making their living with the sale of each basket, typically \$1-\$2 each. When their family home fell victim to the unrelenting earthquake in 2017, they realized the gravity of the situation: it would take years for them to sell enough baskets to afford to rebuild their home.

The D. Gary Young, Young Living Foundation understood the need of the Flores's and many other families in their community and chose to partner with Techo, an organization supporting efforts to provide families still displaced with dependable shelter as they find long-term solutions. Foundation staff alongside Young Living Mexico members established temporary homes for eight families in the area, allowing them time to gather resources to build their forever homes.





# \$1 MILLION RAISED AT CONVENTION

When a community comes together to reach one shared goal, amazing things are bound to happen. Young Living members proved this true, not only raising but exceeding our \$1 million goal at the 2018 International Grand Convention.

This success comes from a variety of channels such as Ride for a Reason quadrupling in size, a record-breaking 3,500 participants in the annual 5K run, and countless donations made by generous members at the Foundation booth in the Expo and throughout Convention.

The money raised in support of Hope for Justice is expanding the fight to end human trafficking with the addition of three new Lighthouse centers in Uganda, six more in Ethiopia, a transit center in Cambodia, as well as the expansion of the Shine Career School. 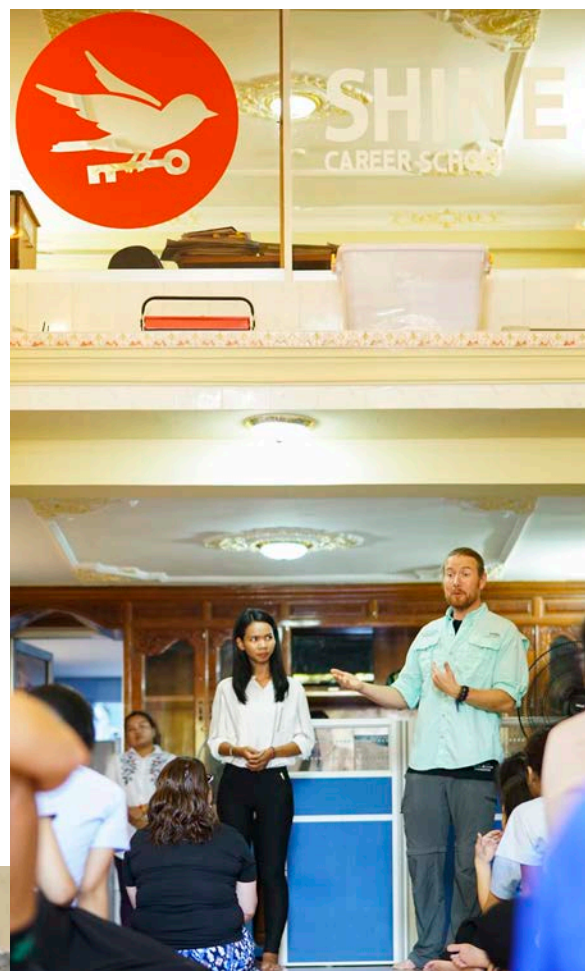




# EXPANSION OF SHINE CAREER SCHOOL

# YOUNG LIVING ON TRACK FOR INTERNATIONAL ACCREDITATION

The Young Living Academy in Chongón, Ecuador, is proud to have initiated the process of becoming an International Baccalaureate, or IB, school. Once in place, this international accreditation program will allow Young Living Academy students the opportunity to study abroad and apply to attend universities outside of Ecuador!

The IB network includes over 4,000 schools worldwide that have chosen to teach programs that develop students who are motivated to succeed in their academics. IB accredited schools typically perform better and students are more likely to enroll at top universities as they outperform other students in many areas.

An IB education fosters creativity and imagination, challenging students to excel academically and personally. This is particularly appealing for the students of the Young Living Academy who typically come from families that are disadvantaged due to economic situations. Through IB programs, students would have the opportunity to explore local and global issues, discuss ways to drive positive change, and to contribute

to a peaceful world through inter-cultural respect and understanding.

The Academy employees working diligently to earn this certification are Mariela Gaybor, International Baccalaureate Coordinator, Paulina Huayamaye, Academy Director, and Andrea Ollague, Young Living Foundation Country Manager. These three women attended an IB training convention in Costa Rica to complete a critical step towards the coveted accreditation.

We will be certain to update you as the process of becoming IB accredited moves forward, and we are very excited for the doors this program will open for our Young Living Academy students.
