In this center, Sole Hope can provide care for patients suffering with the misery of feet infected with jiggers. We also helped fund a new mobile unit for our partner Healing Faith, so they can deliver essential malaria testing, treatment, and education to even the most remote communities in Uganda.

With all we have accomplished in 2019, I am even more excited for the Foundation's future plans. We are looking forward to forming new relationships, developing more partners, and announcing new projects that will have a positive impact in local communities. The Foundation is bringing new awareness by focusing its mission on protecting and empowering our world's young through three pillars: Champion Education, End Exploitation, and Develop Enterprise.

The Young Living Academy celebrates its first graduating class, setting the precedent for the school's impressive 100 percent graduation rate.

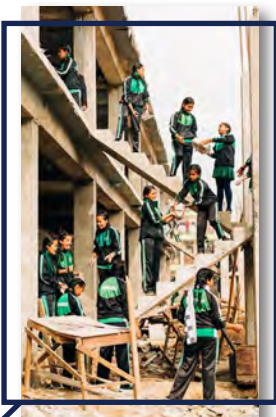

NEW OPPORTUNITIES AT THE ACADEMY

The students were just as joyous to kick off the 10th year of school at the Young Living Academy as they were when the Academy first opened in 2009. In the past decade, the Academy has developed into a beacon of hope in Chongón, Ecuador. In addition to educating up to 350 students, the Academy gives back to the community by offering adult learning classes and providing opportunities for students to improve their neighborhoods.

The class of 2019 included 21 graduates, many of whom are now eager to find their own unique way of making an impact in the world. With the big dreams of our Academy students in mind, we launched the D. Gary Young Global Leadership Fund for Higher Education, a scholarship fund that will help deserving students cover the cost of higher education. This fund will also be available to deserving students and rising leaders supported by our other Foundation partners.

We extend our gratitude to those that supported the success of these students and look forward to another decade of empowerment in action at the Academy.

REBUILD NEPAL

UNLOCKING EDUCATIONAL AND FINANCIAL OPPORTUNITIES

In 2019 we brought Gary's vision of rebuilding Nepal to new heights, restoring 16 schools in the Tanahun district. These schools remained in a state of disrepair years after the devastating earthquakes struck, forcing the schools to close structurally unsafe buildings and turn students away that they would normally have room to accommodate.

To ensure as many children as possible can attend school, local workers and volunteers, with the support of Young Living volunteers on service trips, completed the restoration on seven of the 16 schools in 2019. These efforts have empowered over 5,000 students to re-enroll and receive an education.

We also completed buildings for two women's groups, one of which is empowering mothers to start and sustain successful businesses. Parbati, a survivor of domestic violence and a single mother, found sustainable work assisting with restoration efforts on her children's school. She hopes to set aside some of her earnings to join a group like the Khairanitar cooperative to start a business of her own with her best friend.



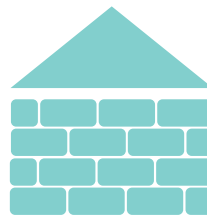

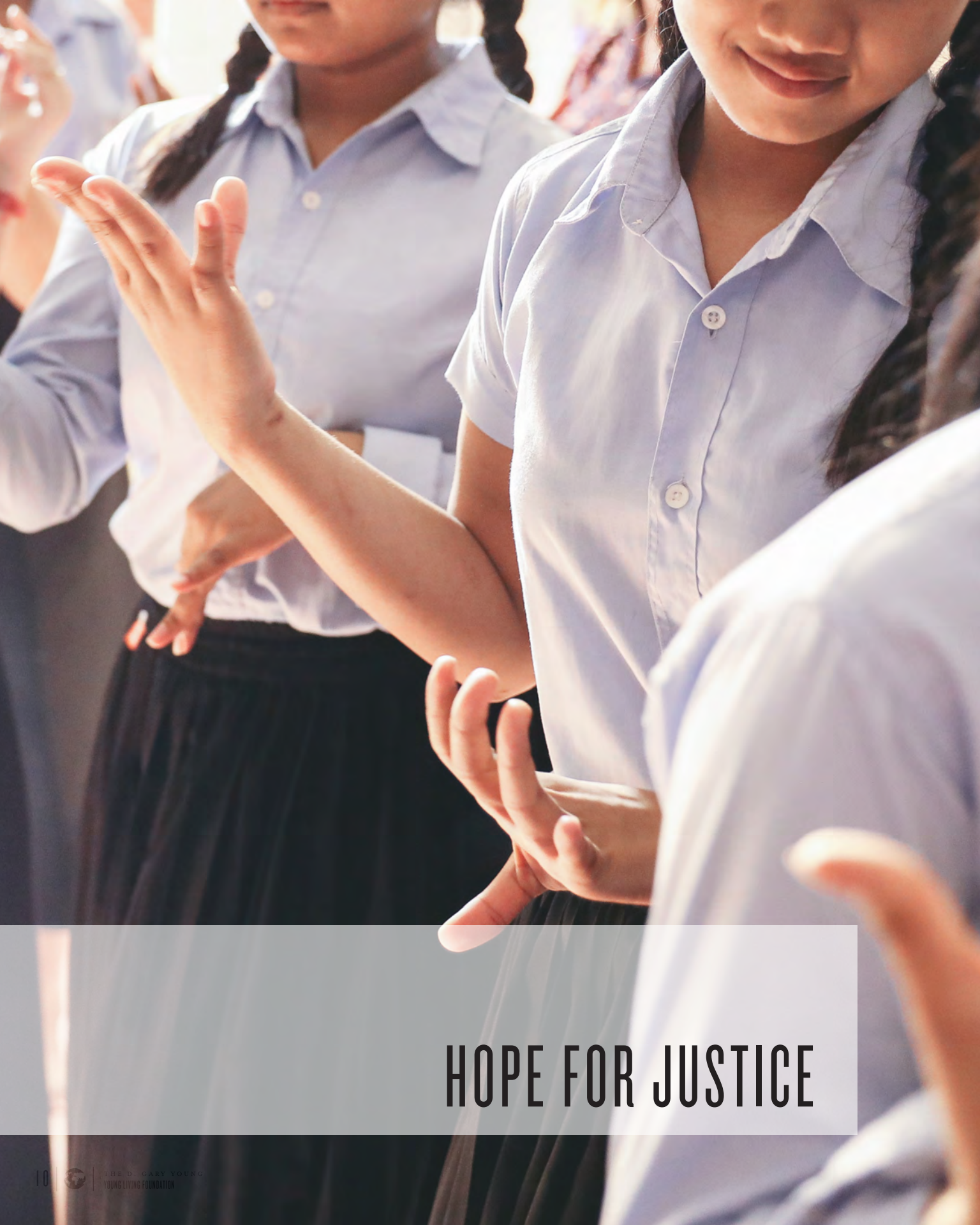

HOPE FOR JUSTICE

EXPANDING THE FIGHT AGAINST EXPLOITATION

As we expanded our partnership with Hope for Justice into Africa, we saw tremendous success stem from our collaborative efforts in Uganda and Ethiopia. The 10 Lighthouse rehabilitation centers we support in these two countries has impacted the lives of 3,281 children who have survived exploitation.

In September, Mary Young, the Chair of our Board and Young Living CEO, visited Uganda to join in the grand opening celebration of the Mary Lighthouse. This Lighthouse employs 11 full-time staff and cares for up to 30 rescued girls at a time as they begin the process of rebuilding their lives and learning to dream again after being exploited and trafficked.

We are so grateful for those who work tirelessly on the ground as the hands and feet of your donations, and we are so thankful for every life changed as we work with Hope for Justice to provide a beacon of hope each day and collaborate with them to bring an end to human trafficking worldwide.

HEALING FAITH UGANDA

MOBILIZING THE FIGHT AGAINST MALARIA

When Healing Faith Uganda's new mobile unit was first deployed to the island of Jagusi, Uganda, they were fortunate to have arrived in time to administer life-saving treatment to two-year-old Cauthara. Her mother, Zura, feared her daughter may not survive as she watched Healing Faith's nurses rush to administer an IV and transport them both to a hospital on the mainland. Shortly after receiving intensive medical care, Cauthara's life began to return to her and Zura expressed thanks to have her happy, healthy toddler back.

Jagusi is one of many islands on Lake Victoria and is home to over 8,000 people. With limited medical resources on the island and limited ability to travel off the island for more advanced care, many families struggle to get the adequate medical care they, or their children, desperately need.

Every penny makes a difference in the fight against malaria, and thanks to the generosity of our donors, we have been able to sponsor the mobile unit so Healing Faith can provide life-saving care and preventative education to even the most vulnerable and isolated communities.

SOLE HOPE

OPENING THE DOORS OF HOPE

On January 11, the Young Living Foundation team stood with Sole Hope staff to celebrate the grand opening of its new Hope Center. In addition to funding the construction of the Hope Center, the Foundation is also sponsoring the center's operations.

More than doubling the capacity of the previous facility, the Hope Center staff provided care to over 1,000 individuals suffering from severe cases of jiggers in its first year.

When 11-year-old Nafunya first arrived at the Hope Center, she struggled to walk as the jigger infestation on her feet was so severe. For weeks, her condition had grown from a nuisance to a debilitating pain and she faced stigma at school due to her red, swollen feet. Hope Center staff carefully removed 118 jiggers from her feet and provided her with a pair of shoes and education.

Nafunya remains jigger-free today and is happy for the opportunity to be a playful child again. Thank you to those who contributed to restore Nafunya's hope, and the hope of thousands of other children.

After a devastating typhoon, the Alejandro T. Manaog Elementary School, located near the Happy Pili Tree Farm—a Young Living partner farm—was severely damaged, forcing the school to combine grades into the remaining structurally sound buildings. Due to lack of space and materials, many students simply stopped going to school.

Rosalina Tan, owner of the Happy Pili Tree Farm, informed the Young Living Foundation of the opportunity to be of service to this school that was in deep need. The Foundation and the farm collaborated to restore the damaged parts of the school, add two new classrooms, bathrooms, and built a sustainable school garden complete with a tilapia pond and duck coop so that no child would worry about going hungry during the school day.

Yana Espinocilla, our project manager on the ground and manager at the Happy Pili Tree Farm, explains the impact the upgrades have had on the school since being completed in October. “Now, the kids are getting better grades, are happier and healthier, the parents are more engaged, and this I believe is because of all the help the Young Living Foundation gave them.”



GIVING BACK IN THE UNITED STATES

The Young Living Foundation is committed to offering a hand up to individuals around the world, including those in our own community. In 2019, we supported 86 U.S.-based nonprofits through in-kind donations and volunteer support.

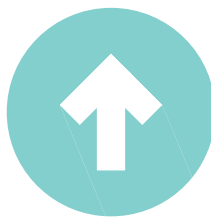

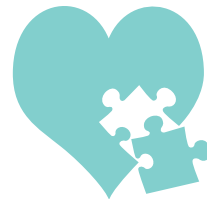

DISASTER RELIEF

In 2019, the Americas fell prey to numerous natural disasters, and thanks to those who generously contributed to our disaster relief fund in 2019, we were able to support numerous communities impacted.

Donations and Young Living's donation match raised more than \$70,000 to help support firefighting and reforestation efforts in Brazil's Amazon rain forest through the Institute of Conservation and Sustainable Development of the Amazon.

In the aftermath of Hurricane Dorian and Tropical Storm Imelda, we contributed a \$100,000 grant to All Hands and Hearts, a U.S.-based organization working to help communities through long-term disaster recovery efforts.

Shortly after the Happy Pili Tree Farm was announced as Young Living's newest partner farm, CNN Philippines began collaborating with Young Living on a four-part docuseries about the farm. In August, HGTV's Extreme Makeover: Home Edition arrived in Utah to change the lives of two deserving families. After connecting with the Foundation, 35 Young Living employees had the opportunity to volunteer, contributing 192 hours to the renovations. Young Living also donated \$1,000 worth of Young Living Products and grocery store gift cards to each family as a house-warming gift.





A WORLD OF SERVICE

From January through December, 122 members from the United States, Australia, Canada, Malaysia, the United Kingdom, and Hong Kong volunteered in communities around the world across 12 service trips.

In January, the Young Living Foundation Ambassadors traveled to Uganda to celebrate the opening of the new Hope Center. In February, members sponsoring graduates at the Young Living Academy traveled to Chongón, Ecuador, to attend graduation and work with the seniors to improve the Academy grounds. In January, March, October, and November, members traveled to the remote Tanahun region in Nepal to help restore 7 of 16 schools.

Young Living CEO and Chair of the Foundation Board, Mary Young, met up with a service-trip team in Uganda to celebrate the opening of the Mary Lighthouse in September. The following month, another team headed to Cambodia to learn more about Hope for Justice's efforts to eradicate exploitation. Rounding out the year, members traveled to Ecuador to build homes for three deserving families of students at the Academy.

To those who had the opportunity to serve, thank you for your dedication and for lending your hands and hearts to these tremendous efforts.



A RECIPE FOR SUCCESS

Every day, kitchen staff at the Young Living Academy prepare two nutritious meals for 400 students and staff. As you can imagine, serving up 800 meals, five days per week is no easy feat! Over the years as the Academy grew, the kitchen did not.

At the 2018 Platinum Retreat, a group of Young Living members recognized a need and sprung to action proposing, fundraising for, and implementing a plan to build a new, larger kitchen for the school that would also accommodate future growth.

It's amazing what can be accomplished when passion meets purpose. Watching this member-led vision grow and create lasting change for everyone who has the opportunity to visit the Young Living Academy has been inspiring, and proves that getting involved can be as easy as identifying a need!



FUNDRAISING IN 2019

Over the years, our efforts have been fueled by the generosity of both our incredible donors and a big-hearted company, which enables us to make a huge impact in communities around the world.

On July 11, 2019, International Essential Oils Day, Young Living donated \$250,000 to the D. Gary Young Global Leadership Fund for Higher Education, and a few weeks later members raised a record-breaking \$1.4 million at the International Grand Convention.

Young Living members inspired us tremendously in 2019. Through creative peer-to-peer fundraisers on our website, individuals and teams raised over \$140,000. Separately, a total of \$363,090 was raised through Scott Schuler's popular convention fundraiser, Ride for a Reason, while talented T-shirt designer Whitney Scott orchestrated a convention T-shirt flash mob that raised \$20,454. The Young Living Foundation Ambassadors hosted the online Empower Auction, facilitating donations from over 40 contributors and raising \$34,160.

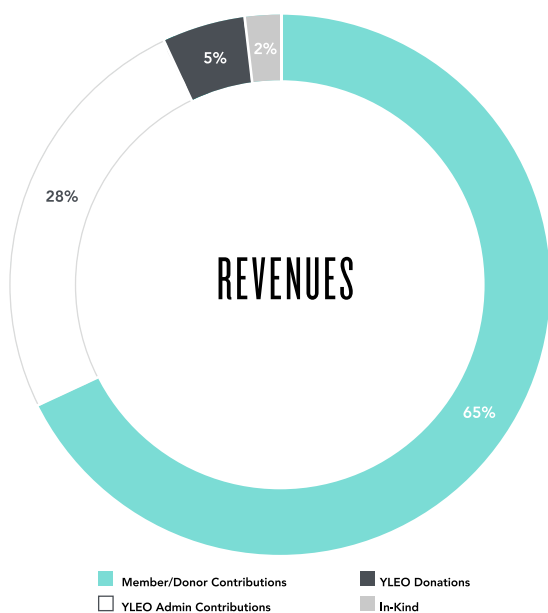

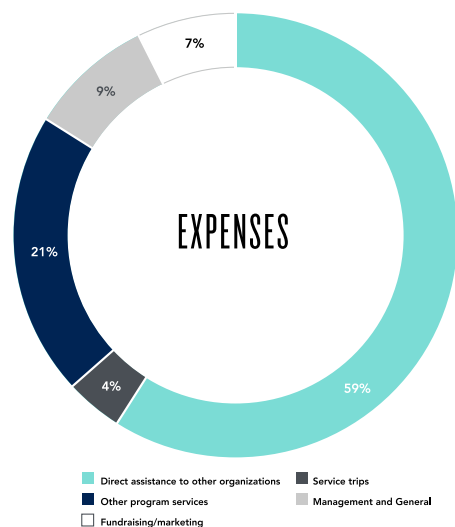

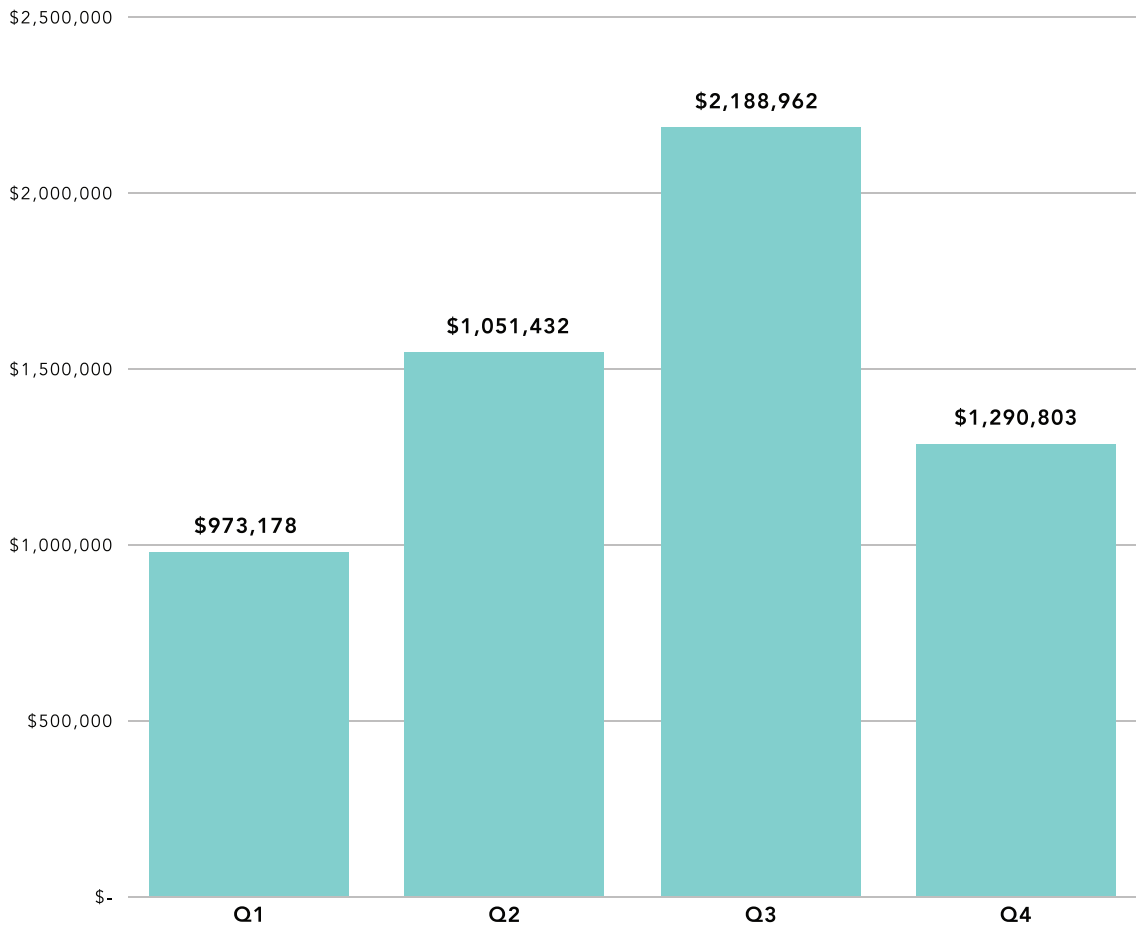
