In 2015, two major earthquakes in Nepal claimed nearly 9,000 lives. Villages in the beautiful Himalayan foothills were completely destroyed. Families were forced to take shelter with livestock before they could build temporary tin homes that are painfully inadequate against the rains and subzero temperatures.

After visiting Nepal in January 2016, Young Living Founder and Chairman of the Board D. Gary Young put a plan in place. In the village of Yarsa, we are rebuilding each home—112 homes in all. In fact, we've already rebuilt the primary school.

YOUNG LIVING ACADEMY NO. 2

We're turning the rebuilt primary school in Yarsa into the second Young Living Academy in the world! The school is officially called the Young Living Academy, Yarsa Primary School. At the outset, more than 40 children will attend this school that's been equipped with new desks and whiteboards. In the near future, we will start a program so Young Living members can sponsor a child at the school.

On average, it takes more than 3,000 bricks to rebuild a home in Yarsa that is between 590 and 600 square feet. That means the cost per brick is about \$1.60 USD.
